#### Message from the Principal:

You may be aware that the NHS have been trying to recruit a school nurse for us for some time. I am pleased to say that I took part in the interview process on Monday of this week, and we have offered the position to one of the candidates. Subject to necessary pre-employment checks, we will have a new school nurse with us - hopefully shortly after the October half term, subject to confirmation.

On a related theme, our new Family Support Officer, Kerry, is due to start with us on Monday. We look forward to welcoming her to the school, and of course to you as parents.

We know how important these roles are in the wider context of school life and look forward to their input in the coming weeks and months.

There have been a lot of staff and children illnesses at the start of term. Despite recruiting heavily last year, we continue to have a number of teaching assistant vacancies, mainly due to an increase in the overall complexity of our children since last year, coupled with a small number of resignations not related to any one factor. To reassure parents, we are recruiting again and have already appointed some new teaching assistants and will continue to do so. We have no intention of closing classes or putting a rota into place but ask once again for your patience whilst we recruit for vacant positions.




