
Dear Parent/Guardian,

Message from the Principal:

The weather has been fairly stormy this week and we were hit pretty hard on the last day of the half term too, with the school suffering significant flooding to communal areas after some extremely heavy rain. I'd just like to pay tribute to the whole staff team, from admin and the site team all the way through to all the teaching teams, for their efforts to ensure the school could open for the children. Everyone helped with mops, towels, and other drying equipment, sectioning off the areas that were still too wet or flooded to be used. It was a quite remarkable effort that got the school ready to go for the start of the day, and then ongoing work especially from the site team to dry out our flooded hall, and then to set to work ensuring it wouldn't happen again by working with a number of agencies including the Local Authority. The drainage of the field that sits behind the school was a big factor in this and has received a lot of attention from the authority to ensure it won't happen again. Unfortunately, we have suffered some serious water damage, somewhat ironically, to our swimming pool, and it is likely to be out of action for at least one more week and potentially longer.

On a completely different topic, on the second weekend of the October half term, Kristen Rutson, who is a teaching assistant within Raven class at Booker Park, organised a 24-hour badminton marathon at her local club to support the school. She was ably supported by members of her family, teammates from the badminton club, and members of the community linked to the club. For 24 hours, they had a continuous game of badminton running, with a children's party as part of the proceedings. It was my privilege to see the last part of the event unfold, with some weary warriors who had foregone sleep for the night and played badminton on top of that, to raise money for Booker Park. In an effort which surpassed any previous efforts, they raised over £2200 - an incredible effort from a dedicated team. Our grateful thanks to Kristen and all those working with her to make such a large amount - you are truly inspirational, thank you. The money will be directed specifically to the PMLD groups within the school with a focus on communication devices.




