Message from the Principal:

Welcome back to school to all those returning to us after the summer break, and an especially warm welcome to those who are new to us. In both cases, I hope your child's start with us in September has gone smoothly. The first few days are usually the most challenging of the year with a change to routine and new faces and relationships to get used to.

I know that parents are keen to see an improvement and development of holiday provision to support them, particularly over the course of the summer. It is in our planning schedule to work on this over the coming weeks with the aim of offering more in the future. Some parents did access Chiltern Music Therapy and the swim sessions we had on offer, and I was pleased to see and hear how well they went. The main bit of feedback from them appears to be it would be good to see more of them.

The summer has been incredibly busy for the site and non-teaching teams, with extensive internal improvements through our buildings. Those of you who drive in to school will have noted we now have some traffic calming speed bumps around the site which support the safety of our children at pick up and drop off; we now have over 400 lights that were upgraded to be more energy efficient; there are a number of additional doors which are now security fobbed providing extra safety for our youngsters; and various parts of the building have had a facelift with some refreshed painting and decorating. We are in the process of setting the goals for the year for our development plan - I'll write further on these topics in due course.

Welcome back to the new school year at Booker Park. I am sure that the summer will not have been relaxing for many of you and the holidays may have felt long, but I hope there will have been positives for you and your families too.

RAAC - Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete in School Buildings

Following the recent press coverage of school building and RAAC (Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete), Buckinghamshire Council has released an updated statement, which reads:

"The Local Authority have previously carried out desk top surveys of maintained schools using historic drawing information and where necessary carried out onsite inspections and found no buildings within the maintained schools' portfolio as having RAAC present". As always, we take this matter very seriously and the Leadership Team are working with

Buckinghamshire Council to ensure all of our facilities are safe for everyone, at all times.







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Local Information: HS2 Railway Works:

From Saturday 19 August to Sunday 29 October, the railway between Aylesbury and Princes Risborough stations will remain closed to passengers' trains whilst work takes place to move approximately 1.8km of the line onto a new embankment built by HS2.

Marsh Lane level crossing closure- November 2023 to Spring 2024:

As part of the work to realign the railway, the Marsh Lane level crossing will be closed to allow the engineers and engineering trains safe continuous access to the railway. This means that Marsh Lane level crossing will be closed to pedestrians, cyclists, and vehicles from Saturday 19 August until Spring 2024.
