- Flexibility: placements can be short term or long term, usually a few weeks, a school term, or ongoing if this is what your business requires.
- Students will usually be available to work 1-3 hours per day, once a week, with the aim of adding more hours or days if this worked for the learner and the business.
- No job or task is too little or too large, so think of the areas your business and your team require additional support, this can all be discussed with the Job Coach when they come to meet you.

#### **Autism Youth Club and Social Hub - Aylesbury Vale**

An autism-friendly youth club in Aylesbury for all genders and ages 10 to 25 years.

A social hub for autistic young people featuring:

- Internet laptops
- Gaming Consoles
- Pool tables and table-tennis
- Cafe and Tuck Shop
- Large Chillout room with Lego corner and large TV
- Safe, quiet and understanding social environment

ACE aims to provide a safe and quiet understanding environment for autistic people of all genders, mainly in the 10 to 17 and 18 to 25 years age ranges, and families, but they are keen to support all ages where we can.

They aim to promote inclusion, social interaction, and positive mental health.

A diagnosis of autism is not required if you feel traits and self-identifying are applicable. Friends/siblings are welcome, if they are understanding of autistic needs, pay the entry fee(s) and follow ACF rules.

They are volunteers, not professionals. They do need a responsible adult(s) to stay with minors and/or vulnerable adults to satisfy their Liability Insurance. Support and activities are available for those who need to stay under these circumstances. If this is a possible issue, please contact them in confidence.

The summer saw a full schedule of update works and developments across both schools. Below are some of the headlines of the works which were undertaken:

#### **Stocklake Park Campus:**

- Over 225 lights were changed to energy efficient LED units, supporting the reduction of our energy usage and sustainability
- New fencing was installed along the top area of the school, enhancing the security
- Considerable updates to our data connections and cabling was completed, to enhance our IT infrastructure
- Additional pedestrian and vehicle safety measures were installed, enhancing the safety for everyone

#### **Booker Park Campus:**

- Over 430 lights were changed to energy efficient LED units, supporting the reduction of our energy usage and sustainability
- New fencing was installed in numerous areas of the school, replacing ageing wooden fencing and enhancing the security and safety for all
- Replacement of one our building heating and ventilation systems, due to mechanical issues
- Surface playground works within the Early Years playground
- Critical roof repairs at BP in one area of the main building
- Additional pedestrian and vehicle safety measures were installed, enhancing the safety for everyone

These are just a small selection of all works which were undertaken to further develop and maintain our facilities, for the benefit of all our pupils and staff.

October half-term sees a schedule of further works and service checks taking place again. We look forward to updating you on this.



#### A big thank you to parents and guardians for selecting your meal choices for the new school half term on the Arbor App.

We are pleased with the feedback we have received regarding the increased variety of meal options now available to pupils and continue to build on this.

As a reminder, in addition to the freshly prepared hot school dinners we now also offer a jacket potato or a (healthy and nutritious) packed lunch daily. These additional choices are an alternative for pupils who don't like the main meal on a specific day and will ensure they can still enjoy a healthy meal.

We had the opportunity to meet a number of parents and guardians at the recent parents evenings where we were able to show off some of the meal options and offer a taster session. The feedback from these sessions was positive and it was great to be able to answer your questions in person.
