Introduction to Jo Smith, Booker Park School Nurse:

Following my recent appointment as School Nurse here at Booker Park School, I just wanted to take the opportunity to introduce myself.

My overall role involves the monitoring of any health-related issues and/or concerns that may arise on a day-to-day basis, in relation to your child within the school environment, as well as supporting staff, children and often parents, with children who have underlying medical conditions.

Owing to the fact that some children's health needs are more complex medically than others, it is inevitable that at times, I will have a greater level of involvement with some, more than others, which I am sure as parents you will understand. However, should you have any cause for concern whatsoever, in relation to your child's health and physical and mental wellbeing, please do not hesitate to contact me either via the school office or via email. My job also includes liaising with other healthcare professionals and colleagues, such as the Community Nursing Team for Children with Disabilities, the Children's Diabetes Specialist Nurse, the Children's Epilepsy Specialist Nurse, in addition to CAMHS, who may be involved in your child's care.

Other areas where I am able to assist include advice and support with toilet training and continence assessments, the ordering of nappies/pads where a child over the age of 5 is not receiving them but is entitled to them, dependent upon their toileting capacity and any amendment required with your current pad order delivery, such as size, type and absorbency of pad. However, please note that I am unable to increase your quota in terms of entitlement.

As a parent myself, who is mindful of the need to reduce wastage and of the current cost of living crisis, I am eager to run a pad exchange in an effort to assist parents, thereby enabling people to trial new sizes and brands of products, prior to orders being placed. Therefore, where people are struggling for space in the event of having received a new delivery and having old unused stock that they no longer require which NRS have failed to collect, any donations would be very welcome.



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
